

Fee structure of the Registration Services on the Intergis

1 April 2018 – 31 March 2019

1. BASIC SERVICES

- a. Capturing of birth notifications.
- b. Capturing of inspection/registration results.
- c. Cancellations, transfers and reinstatements.
- d. An annual per capita list as on 1 April with all the animals in the possession of the member (the annual per capita fee will also be levied on the number of animals on this per capita list).
- e. The Intergis Interface is also available to users for accessing their information. Individual members will have access to their own information and a breeders' society will have access to the information of all its members from which enquiries and reports can be generated.

Capturing of data on the INTERGIS

The Data can be submitted directly to the INTERGIS at no additional cost in one of the following ways:

- Electronic files can be submitted through any software (e.g. Beefpro), provided the file format is compatible with the INTERGIS.
- Directly on the system through the INTERGIS Interface (on arrangement).
- Via a paper option that should be send to the ARC Data Editing section in Bloemfontein.
